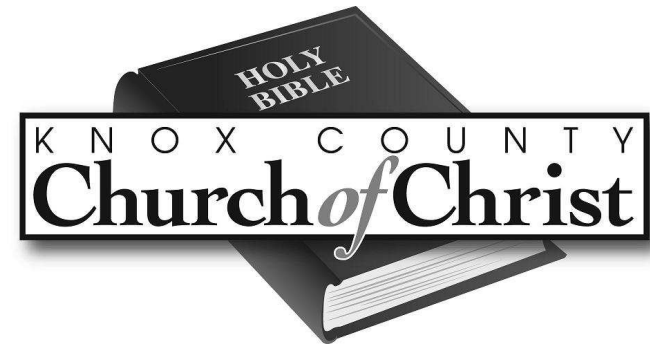

## From The Preacher's Pen

### "A DECEIVING TRACT"

A while back, I picked up a religious tract in a restaurant. Although the intention of those who published the tract was good and honorable, sadly, the tract is deceitful in that it does not teach the whole truth concerning becoming a Christian and entering the Way—that is, Christ (John 14:6).

Four things were stated in the tract that one should do: First, realize that God loves you! John 3:16 is quoted: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Second, realize that everyone is a sinner! Two Scripture passages are quoted: "As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one" (Rom. 3:10). "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God" (3:23). Third, realize that sin has a price that must be paid! Romans 6:23 is quoted: "For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Fourth, realize that Christ died to pay your price! Two Scriptures are again quoted: "But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (5:8) "In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins" (Col. 1:14). The tract then states, finally, pray. Ask Jesus Christ to be your Savior, and claim His promise of eternal life! Romans 10:13 is then quoted: "For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."

Is that how people became Christians in the first century? Is that what the apostles told those people to do? Note that none of the Scriptures quoted in the tract is from the book of Acts. Acts is the book where we read of people becoming Christians. The Scriptures quoted, except John 3:16, come from the epistles, letters written to Christians. As regarding calling on the name of the Lord, we read in Acts that Saul of Tarsus (Paul the apostle) was told: "And now why tarriest thou? arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord" (Acts 22:16). Baptism is nowhere mentioned in the tract—yet every case of conversion to Christ recorded in Acts shows those converted were baptized. Why does the tract not mention this vital part of becoming a Christian?

Let us never be deceived into accepting another gospel which, in reality, is not another gospel. Let us never cease to preach, and teach people how to become Christians in the same way as the early Christians did—as recorded in the book of Acts; and let us reject these four steps to becoming a Christian that teach another way of salvation as opposed to that taught by the Christians of the first century.
