

From The Preacher's Pen

"THE GOSPEL OF THE SECOND CHANCE"

Sin, whether conceived of as an act or regarded as a principle, is set forth under various aspects in the Sacred Writings. Numerous terms, both in the Hebrew of the Old Testament and in the Greek of the New Testament, are required to present it in all of its multiform phases. Of frequent occurrence is the Hebrew word hatah, rendered in the Septuagint (the Greek translation made from Hebrew about 300 years before Christ came) by the Greek term hamartia, signifying to miss one's aim; hence, to miss the mark. It is a figure taken from the practice of archery, the use of bows and arrows. By an easy transition, the word, originally signifying to miss the target at which one sights in a literal sense, came to mean an error of the understanding, and then a bad action, an evil deed.

If one shoots an arrow at the target and misses the first time, he does not fling his bow aside after one try and confess defeat. It is good sportsmanship to try and try again. A miss is indeed a challenge few red-blooded sportsmen can resist. It is recognized that with practice comes proficiency, and that one may by it attain to a degree of skill little dreamed of at the beginning. We all want a second chance at the target.

In a vitally important and truly wonderful sense the Gospel of Christ may be styled the Gospel of Second Chance! For many centuries men have done much speculation about whether there will be a second chance in the next world. All such is worthless and vain. The period of man's probation is fixed for this life, and he who allows it to pass without preparation commits an eternal sin. "He that believeth not shall be damned" (Mark 16:16). Those who obey not the Gospel shall suffer punishment, *even* eternal destruction from the face of the Lord and from the glory of his might, when he shall come to be glorified in his saints (2 The. 1:9-10).

There is something much better than a second chance in the next world—a second chance in this world! How wonderful that the Lord enables us to try, and try, and try again! So long as life lasts, there is no limit to His patience and forbearance. "My little children, these things write I unto you that ye may not sin. And if any man sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous" (1 John 2:1). "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1:9). The blood of "Jesus his Son cleanseth [present tense, linear action, keeps on cleansing] us from all sin" (1:7).

Repentance is the price of a new round of shots at the target. God, as the Great Scorer, says, as it were: "Now is the accepted time to try again! Now is the day to hit the mark!" In the parable of the Pharisee and the publican the Pharisee

stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as the rest of men, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. I fast twice in the week; I give tithes of all that I get. But the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote his breast, saying, God, be thou merciful to me a sinner (Luke 18:11-13).

The Pharisee was so smug and self-satisfied in his attitude that he did not bother to see whether

he hit the mark or not, but the publican said: "God, be merciful to me, a man who has missed the mark." And our Lord said, in effect: "I tell you, this man went down to his house to try again, and the other did not!"

From the far country, slowly, wearily, in rags, the prodigal came back to his father. He begins his oft-rehearsed speech: "Father, before heaven, and in thy sight, I have missed the mark. I do not deserve another try. I ask only to be permitted to be as one of thy hired servants, and make bows and arrows for better men." The father drowns out his words in a sea of love and devotion. As he rains kisses on the returned wanderer, he shouts: "Bring out a bow and give it to him." The elder brother complains: "But, father, he has his bow and missed the mark." "Never mind," the father answers. "Bring out the best bow and give it to him. My boy has come back to try again." How grateful all of us should be that the Lord allows us to come back and try again!
